





#### <u>Documenting progress and development</u>

Throughout our Wild Tribe sessions, observations will be taken using the same method we use in our indoor environment. We will use post it notes to record the children accessing the curriculum. This method allows us to tap into each child's current interests, scaffold their learning appropriately and gain a deep understanding of every child's holistic development. In addition, we use our iPads to take photographs, these are used in your child's learning journeys and our Nursery floor book, we also update our Class Dojo page regularly.

As well as accessing the curriculum, the children will be learning how to use a variety of tools and skills safely and competently. These are great life skills for them to be exposed to from a young age. Skill use is recorded in each child's learning journey by a picture and a write up documenting the skills practiced during the session.
